**Friendly reminder that the Village has a Nuisance Abatement and Property Standards Bylaw.**

**Highlights of this bylaw:**

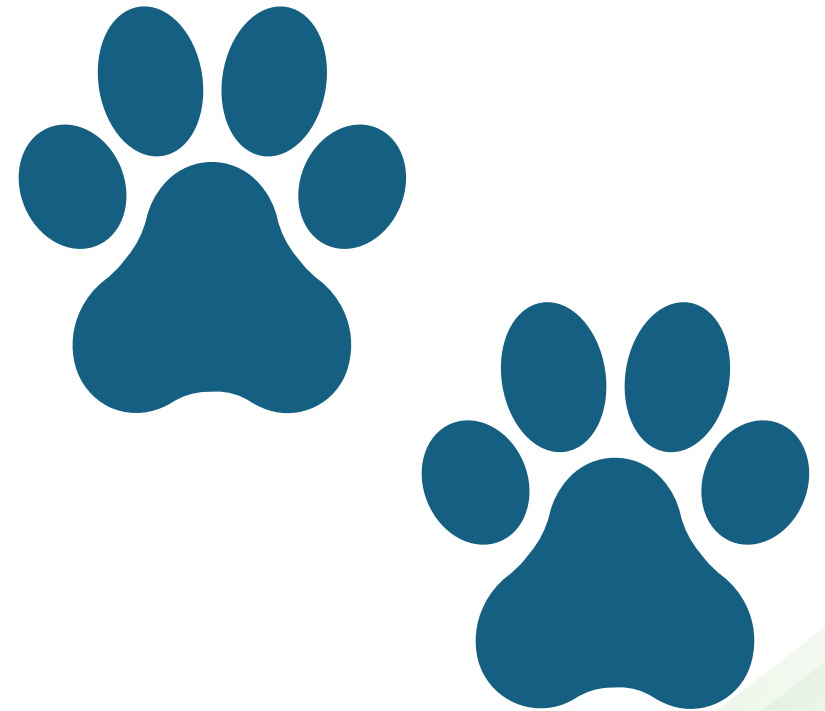
- keep lawns cut and trimmed.
- Only 1 unlicensed vehicle permitted on your property
- Any wood to be stacked appropriately.
- Yards are to be kept neat and clean Bylaw enforcement will be appointed soon and have the authority to issue clean up orders, etc.

# Bylaw 2018-04

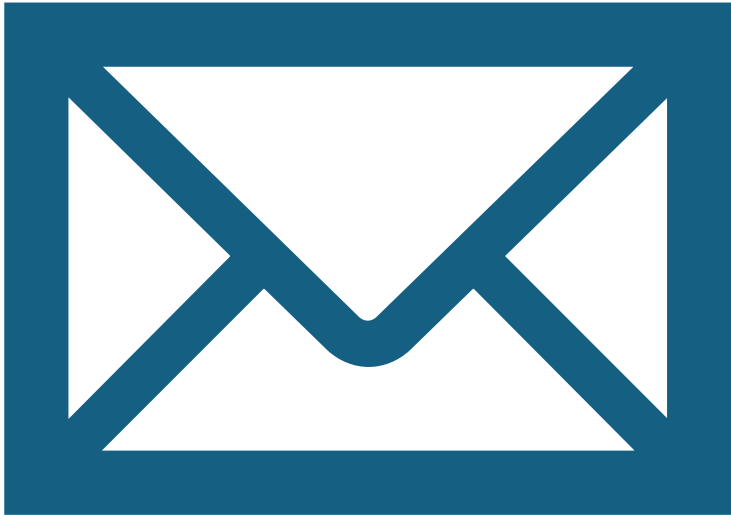
- Bylaw to licence and regulate the running at large of animals.
- This bylaw states owners shall not permit their dogs to create a nuisance, no dog or cat shall run at large in the municipality, as well as every person who owns a dog or cat over 3 months must obtain a license.
- Please note – Contravention of the bylaw could lead to monetary fines to the animal.

- Thank you to all that have licensed their furry babies. Licensing your animals help to keep them safe - as their picture(s) are included in the animal registry. If your animal is missing, is trapped or brought to the Village office - staff will have a contact number for you. The Village does have "animal" Bylaws that include: Animals at Large Not allowing your animal to impose on others (allowing your dog to bark non stop, during the night, etc)

# IMPORTANT Local News Update



- Please welcome Dr Bazaz and his family originally from Calgary to Preeceville. He will be starting his orientation in February.
- The phone at the Preeceville clinic now has advanced features to allow staff to serve you better
- Watch for posters at your pharmacies for information on walk in clinics in the area as well as a QR code which allows you to book Dr. appointments etc
- There is currently a new pilot project happening in Canora with Aspen Ambulance. This pilot project focuses on ambulance staff performing limited services- such as dressing changes, & lab draws in the patients home. Please note - this will not disrupt emergency ambulance services. If the ambulance gets an acute call, it is a priority and ambulance staff may need to leave during the in home visit. The goal is to be able to offer these services in other communities once the pilot project is complete and data is reviewed.\*\*currently this service is only being offered using current staffing so it is limited to a small number of patients
- Please call 9-1-1 in an emergency if you are unsure which ER is open. The ambulance can advise, assess and even meet you on the highway if you are driving to the ER.
- RADAR - an assessment for dementia and alzheimers is being offered currently once per month in Canora. Due to the staffing levels required to complete these assessments - currently a maximum of 2 patients can be assessed per month. Please note this requires a referral from your family physician. As well, a family member must attend any appointments. This is a new program offered in rural communities in conjunction with the U of S.

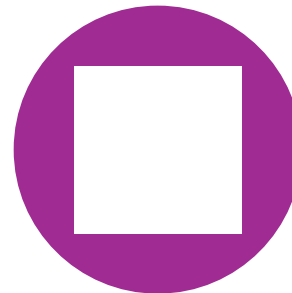
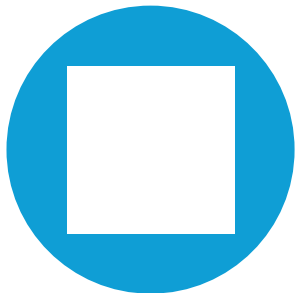
